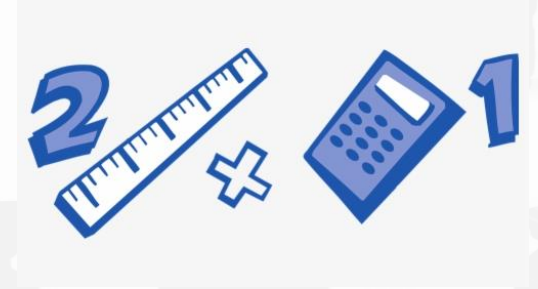

City & Guilds Construction and Plumbing Courses

All C&G programmes are designed to equip individuals with practical workforce skills and knowledge needed to work within the construction and plumbing workforce.

- Level 1 qualifications are designed to give students an introduction into plumbing and construction whilst improving their Maths and English skills.
- Level 2 qualifications are ideal for students who aim to build their career in construction through a specialist trade skill. This route offers them the opportunity to gain underpinning knowledge and skills within the construction and plumbing workforce which will allow them to progress to employment or onto Level 3.
- Level 3 C&G qualifications are a natural progression from Level 2 allowing students to further develop their vocational knowledge, skills and competencies. Students usually progress to employment or further training to become a qualified Plumbing Engineer.

- A Level 2 qualification is considered to be the industry standard. Obtaining this level can lead to a career as a bricklayer.

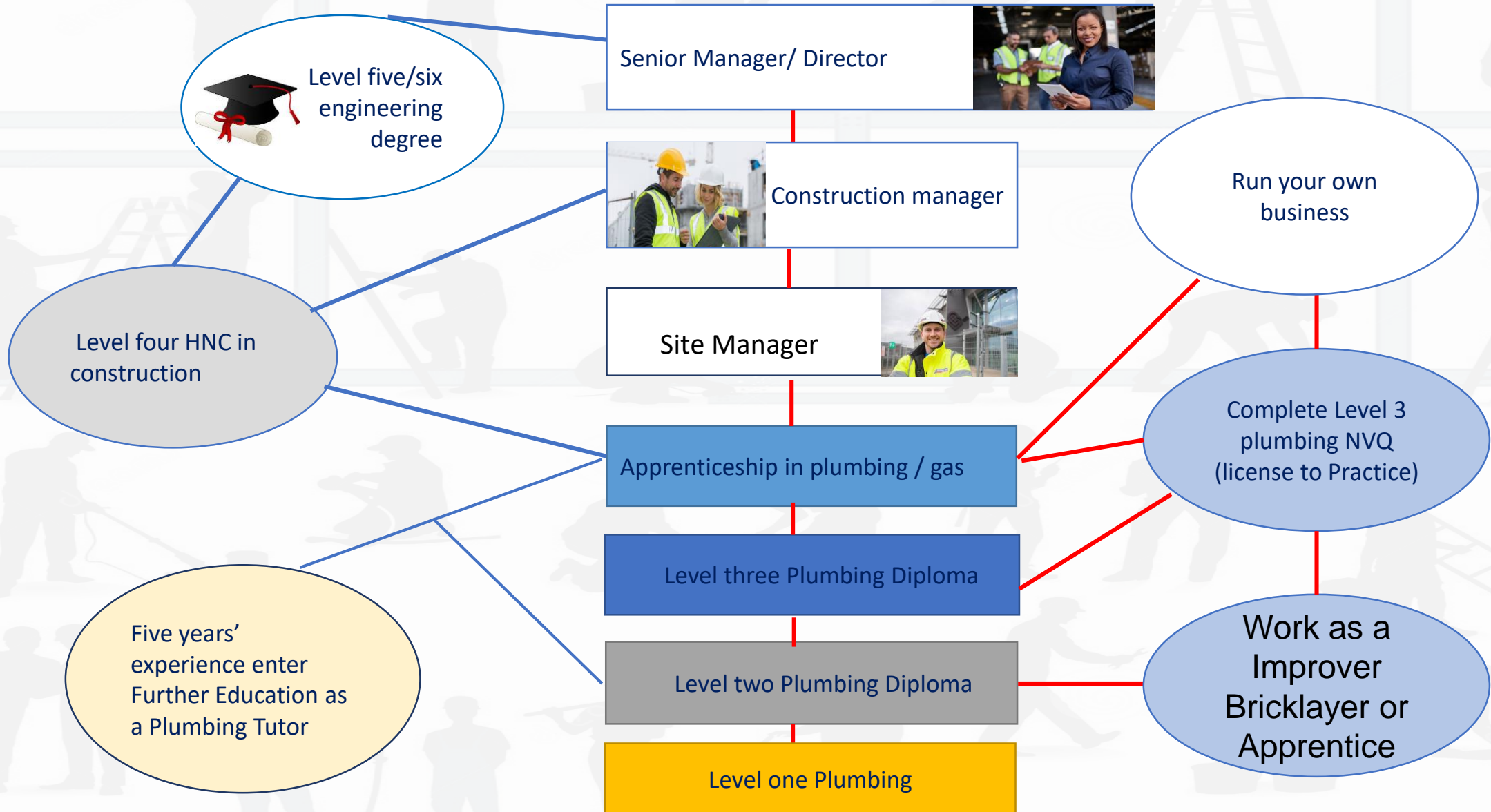
