Imagine what would be possible if you believed in yourself and if you went all in. 5 Minute Journal A way to start your morning with practices that support gratitude and bring awareness to intentional actions that enhance your life. This conditions your brain to become positive focus and ensures you begin each day with purpose. You don't need to buy a journal, all you need is a pen and notepad, the questions are:

In the morning, after you wake up:
Today I am experiencing gratitude for:
Three mini goals for making today great:
My today's affirmation is: (write who you are in positive terms i.e. I am successful)
In the evening, before you go to bed:
Three things that happened today for which I am grateful?
How I might have advanced the quality of my day?

Pomodoro – Study Skills Technique

If you are struggling with your studies, or you are looking for a new technique, you can try pomodoro. The pomodoro technique utilizes alternating study and break times of 25 and 5 minutes, respectively. Each of these 25minute bursts of productivity is called a "pomodoro", named after the tomato timer used by Francesco Cirillo in the 1990's.

If this is your first time applying for a GCSE English course, or you do not have GCSE English - grade 3, you will be asked to complete a GCSE English assessment, so that we can ensure this programme is right for you. As a part of this assessment, you will be asked to complete either an imaginative or transactional writing task (250 words). We suggest that to prepare for this, you should look into the above tasks and resources that relate to writing letters, speeches or a short story. In addition, you will be assessed on your grammar, spelling and punctuation.

If you are a learner who does not feel that the grade you received in August 2020 is representative of your abilities, there will be an opportunity for you to retake your GCSE exams in November. Please remember to revise the following: comprehension, language and structure, evaluation, comparison of writer's ideas and writing (content, organisation and spelling, punctation and grammar).
