
Student Experience

- Last year we know students enjoyed, hairdressing trips, opportunities to enter competitions, guest speakers introducing new tools and equipment and products.


Exemplary

- This year we will be giving out attendance prizes. If your attendance is 95%-100% we will enter you into a draw every month.




Gold Status

The practical lessons are also quite fun especially at times like Valentine's Day and Christmas because the students compete for the best hairstyle. I am improving myself in the practical lessons as well it may not seem like I am making big progress but the small progress I see in my work is undeniable when I started this course I didn't even know how to use hair tongs and now I do and I could only do a basic plait before but now I can French braid, Dutch braid, fishtail braid, etc.
