Quick Start Guide for Libraries

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BORROW THE INTERNET: Kajeet SmartSpot[®] Lending Program

Kajeet will expand the reach and benefits of free access to the internet to underserved youth and communities by introducing a pilot Kajeet SmartSpot[®] Program, which will enable them to borrow a mobile WiFi hotspot device for free from the Library for a sustained period of time. SmartSpot[®] devices use cellular networks to create a personal broadband internet hotspot and provide portable, high-speed internet connectivity that can be shared between multiple users.

This initiative will help to bridge a major gap in the availability of the internet for a critical segment of the population which has the most to gain from its use. The pilot Kajeet SmartSpot[®] Program will provide quality access and allow users to continue to learn, work, explore, and create beyond library and school hours.

This initiative will allow 20 students to freely borrow a SmartSpot[®] device for a one month loan period. Students will be selected through an application process and recommendation from their school district.

Training in the use of SmartSpot[®] devices is mandatory for those selected. In addition to the students, training will be extended to their parents /caregivers to enable them to provide support and augment their own digital literacy skills. We will analyze the purpose and hours of use, as well as the number of household users. We will also track usage of scholastic and library resources, and use surveys to determine user awareness of educational programs, user satisfaction, and increased technology skills, such as confidence in using the internet and enhanced understanding of the internet.

At the conclusion of the pilot year, the program may be expanded with the following goals in mind:

GOAL 1:

Increase household access to at home broadband internet

GOAL 2: Raise digital exposure and confidence

GOAL 3:

Increase engagement with library and school learning resources

GOAL 4:

Establish a scalable public library model for tackling the national digital divide

Sample Guidelines

Below is a sample Terms of Use page that you may follow or customize for your program. In the "Tools for Your Program" section of this packet, page 7, there is a blank Terms of Use page for you to fill in with appropriate requirements, restrictions and other details for your program. Electronic Signature fields have been provided.

WHO CAN BORROW (all criteria must be met):

- Public school students grades 6 12.
- Must attend school in same County as the Library.
- Must reside in a household without broadband internet access.
- Possess a Library card in good standing (less than \$10 in fines).
- Agree to participate in surveys and other outcome based evaluations.

ELIGIBILITY:

Borrowers will be determined through an application process and School District recommendations. Students and parents/caregivers must attend an orientation/training session.

USER AGREEMENT:

Must be signed by a parent or caregiver.

BORROWING LIMIT:

1 device per household.

CONTENT:

Users must agree to the SmartSpot Terms of Use

USAGE FEE: Free. (4G/LTE connection)

CIRCULATION: Borrow for one month increments (must renew once a month by completing an on line survey).

OVERDUE FEE: \$1/DAY. Overdue devices will be deactivated.

REPLACEMENT FEE: Lost or damaged device — \$139.99

SUPPORT: Library Information Technology Staff.

RECHARGE DEVICE: Fully recharge device before returning it.

RETURN DEVICE: To the local branch Library.

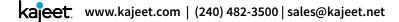
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BEYOND THE SMARTSPOT®: Bring Your Own Device

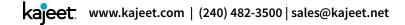
