Patrick Terminals Protected Industrial Action Update

Freight & Trade Alliance (FTA) and the Australian Peak Shippers Association (APSA) wish to advise that we have received notification from Patrick Terminals that the recent "Protected Industrial Action (PIA)" by the Maritime Union of Australia (MUA) has resulted in the reduction of available labour at three of their terminals.

This action has resulted in the following direct impact at their terminals:

Patrick Terminals - Sydney AutoStrad

- Three shifts were not worked over the weekend due to labour unavailability resulting from PIA.
- Sydney terminal delays are **now approx. 2.5 days.**
- With ongoing PIA, delays for vessels arriving at the terminal are expected to increase over the next fortnight.

Patrick Terminals - Brisbane AutoStrad

- Several vessels sat idle at Patrick Terminals Brisbane AutoStrad over the weekend due to reduced labour availability as a result of the PIA.
- Whilst this delayed several vessel departures, the terminal is expected to recover quickly and restore schedule.

Patrick Terminals - Fremantle

 Whilst there has been a reduction in available labour, the terminal experienced minor impact over the weekend.

Patrick Terminals is seeking to actively sub-contract vessels, particularly in Sydney, in order to minimise the direct impact of this industrial action on our customers. However, there is currently no availability for sub-contracting relief due to current delays being experienced at other terminal operators.
