


Preparing Students for the Return to Campus - Your Communication Strategy Checklist

Whether a student is coming to campus for the first time or returning for their senior year, make sure they have everything they need for a smooth transition - from move-in date reminders to available academic and support resources.

With any student communication plan, using a variety of channels to reach them is essential. You can't expect them to answer every phone call or email, so supplementing your efforts with text messages and a chatbot can make sure your important messages aren't missed.

Check these items off your communication to-do list in the weeks leading up to the start of the semester to ensure your students are feeling prepared and supported!



2-4 Weeks Before the Start of the Semester



Texting



Topics to Cover:

- Move-in details



Date/time, parking information

- COVID vaccine reminder and any other health requirements for your campus

- Introduce Student Services



The transition from high school to college or from semester to semester can be overwhelming, but your team is here to help

- Academic preparation



Ask if students feel prepared academically and provide information about Academic Support Services

- Welcome Week events/information




Get students excited about coming to campus

Texting Templates:

Hi <FIRST NAME>, it's <STAFF NAME> from the Residence Life department at <COLLEGE NAME>! Move-in day is just 2 weeks away, so check your email for more information about your designated move-in time and where to park. Do you have any questions/concerns? See you on campus soon!

Hi <FIRST NAME>, it's <ADVISOR NAME> from the Academic Advising department! Just checking in to see how you're feeling about classes starting in a few weeks. Reply with a 👍 or 👎!

Hi <FIRST NAME>, it's <STAFF NAME> from <COLLEGE NAME>'s Student Health office! Don't forget that you must be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 before coming to campus, and you'll need to bring your vaccine card with you on move-in day. If you need anything, feel free to reply to this text!





Texting

Topics to Cover:

- Move-in reminder



Ask if there's anything students need for a smooth move

- General tips for starting off the semester strong




Study tips, academic support services, library resources and hours of operation

Texting Templates:

Hi <FIRST NAME>, it's <STAFF NAME> from Student Services! With the start of classes just 1 week away, I wanted to share with you a link to the library resources on campus so you can find the perfect study spot 📖: <URL>!

Chatbot

Topics to Cover:

- Gauge academic readiness



If a visitor identifies as a current student, ask how they're feeling about the transition. If they reply that they're feeling uneasy, connect them to support resources or offer up a meeting with their advisor.


- On-campus activities/organizations



Provide information about student activities, getting involved in athletics or Greek life, and share Welcome Week events.

Texting

Topics to Cover:

- General student check-in



How was your first week? Are classes going well?

- Information about the class add/drop period



Keep students informed of upcoming deadlines, provide support to students feeling academically overwhelmed.

- Tips to getting involved on campus





Clubs/organizations to join, upcoming sporting events, pep rallies, activities in a residence hall, etc.

Texting Templates:

Chatbot

Topics to Cover:

- Schedule a meeting with an academic advisor



Begin planning for next semester's class registration, check in to see how students are handling their workload, major/minor declaration, etc.

- Upcoming events on campus



Attend sporting events, homecoming, volunteer opportunities, etc.

- Class registration and add/drop information



Deadline awareness, academic requirements to stay on track for graduation.


