

We are very excited about the new regulations and can't wait to be able to welcome you and our other foreign guests! For now, our understanding of the requirements is as follows:

- 1. Negative PCR test result within 72 hours prior to travel, from the last flight boarded.
- 2. Complete vaccination, which must be verified before entering Chile through the Chilean Government to obtain a mobility pass*.
- 3. Fill out the Travelers Affidavit form online, within 48 hours before arrival in Chile.
- 4. Medical insurance with a minimum coverage of USD \$30,000, which covers any expenses caused by Covid-19.
- 5. Upon arrival, tourists must get a second PCR test, and then travel directly to a specified place of stay and wait there for their test result. Once a negative result is obtained, they may end the quarantine period.
- 6. A daily follow-up form will be sent via email by the government over 14 days following entry to the country.

*The mobility pass may be obtained <u>here</u>. We strongly suggest starting the verification process 3 weeks-1 month prior to travel as it may take up to that time to receive verification.
