
YOUR ITINERARY

ACTIVITY LEVEL

This trip requires a moderate to high level of mobility, as the hotel has no elevators and is spread out so all of the rooms have a view. Wheelchairs and scooters cannot be accommodated in the vans used on excursions as they do not have lifts or places to store them. The excursions themselves are quite physical with offerings like hiking, biking, horseback riding, etc. However, there are a few scenic drives and walks that are considered 'easy.' If you do have limited mobility, you are required to travel with someone who can assist you.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Due to the remote location of the Tierra Patagonia Adventure Spa Hotel, Olivia strongly recommends that you purchase travel insurance that includes medical coverage as well as emergency medical evacuation coverage. The nearest hospital is 4.5 hours away and the nearest medical facility is 1 hour away.

Santiago is the capital and largest city in Chile and sits in a valley on the canalized Mapocho River, surrounded by the snow-capped Andes and the Chilean Coast Range. The city was founded as Santiago del Nuevo Extremo, Santiago of the New Frontier, in 1541 by the Spanish conquistador Pedro de Valdivia. Prior to the Spanish settlers taking over and ruling the area, the original inhabitants were the Picunche Indians.

5-Night Easter Island Pre-Stretchers

Isla de Pascua, also known as Easter Island and to locals by its indigenous name—Rapa Nui—is an isolated volcanic island and Chilean territory in Polynesia. It's famed for its archaeological sites, including the nearly 900 monumental statues called moai that were created by inhabitants during the 13th through 16th centuries. The moai are carved human figures with oversize heads, often resting on massive stone pedestals called ahus; Ahu Tongariki displays the largest group of upright moai.

FLIGHT INFORMATION

You will need to fly into and out of Punta Arenas Airport (PUQ), via Santiago (SCL), the main arrivals airport into Chile. You may also fly to El Calafate Airport (FTE) through Buenos Aires, Argentina (AEP).

PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE (PUQ)—Fly through Santiago, Chile, on Wednesday, March 16: Transfers depart from the Punta Arenas airport for the hotel at 10:30 am and 3 pm. Make sure your flight arrival time coincides with these transfers; otherwise, you may have a long wait or will need to overnight in Punta Arenas. Most flights from Europe and the US arrive in Santiago in the morning, and you can connect with a domestic flight to Punta Arenas departing from the same airport once you clear customs in Santiago.

Return transfers depart the hotel at 8 am, 10 am, and 1:30 pm. Your departure transfer will be scheduled based on our flight time. Please ensure your return flight from Punta Arenas to Santiago does not depart before 1:30 pm.

EL CALAFATE, ARGENTINA (FTE)—Fly through Buenos Aires, Argentina, on Wednesday, March 16: Transfers depart the Eolo Hotel in El Calafate at 8 am and the El Calafate Airport at 9 am and arrive at Tierra Patagonia at approximately 2 pm. The return transfer departs the hotel at 8 am and will arrive in El Calafate Airport at approximately 2 pm.

PUERTO NATALES, CHILE—There are no flights to Puerto Natales in March; however, if you get to Puerto Natales via bus or other transportation, a transfer time will be coordinated for you
