



PHOTO PORTFOLIO

The final for yearbook journalism is to create a portfolio of your best published work. You need to collect tear sheets showing your 10 best published photos and present them creatively. The photo credit and caption also need to be included. For each sample, write a brief description (2-3 sentences) explaining what elements of photography are present, how you set up the shot, and why this represents your best work this year. You may also include any other details about the photo that you wish.

The portfolio will be graded as follows:

- 1 Quality of samples. Each photo should incorporate at least one of the elements of photo composition and meet all of the expectations of scholastic journalism photography.
- 2 Quantity. Ten published photos, photo credit, caption and descriptions are included.
- 3 Presentation and organization. The portfolio is well organized and is presented in a professional format that takes into consideration principles of good design.
- 4 Writing. The descriptions are written using journalistic standards including spelling, punctuation, capitalization and AP Style.
