In 2018 we were proud to provide additional opportunities for the students of Ras Al Khaimah, such as the Future Careers Forum, to help students think about the world of possibilities available to them on leaving high school. ## **Our Community**



# Our Progress & Impact: Research

As part of its mandate to support evidenced-based planning among the region's policymakers, the Al Qasimi Foundation views research as the cornerstone of its mission. The Foundation both conducts and promotes—through diverse grant offerings and partnerships—high-quality research focused on Ras Al Khaimah, the UAE, and broader Gulf region. The Foundation collaborates with scholars and esteemed universities across the globe and works to connect these researchers with relevant policymakers. The result has been progressive, applied research in the areas of education, arts and culture, health, and community development.

This year the Foundation focused on increasing the accessibility of its research and sustainability of its efforts through expanding the corpus of its open-access and Arabic language content, as well as through the deepening of its partnerships and collaborations with local scholars, practitioners, ministries, and policymakers.

The Foundation was also pleased to host the 8<sup>th</sup> Biannual Gulf Comparative Education Society (GCES) symposium, *Public, Private, and Philanthropy: Exploring the Impact of New Actors on Education in the GCC* in Ras Al Khaimah; establish a partnership with the UAE Education and Human Resources Council to collaborate on a parental involvement research project and forthcoming symposium; and to expand two research pilots on Arabic reading fluency and reintegrating at-risk boys into secondary schools.

# Our Progress & Impact: Capacity Development

One way the Al Qasimi Foundation stewards its research findings is by developing and providing strategic services and support in order to build individual and local capacity across public sectors. These capacity development efforts cultivate local talent and support institutional improvements through evidence-based education initiatives.

This year, the Foundation focused on improving teacher quality through providing accredited professional development courses, deepening its formal collaborations with the Ministry of Education, developing gifted and talented students, and serving at-risk youth through supplemental life skills programming. In addition, through its successful partnerships the Foundation was able to implement initiatives such as its third teacher exchange program in partnership with the Ministry of Education and the Institute of International Education, and the 2018 Future Careers Forum in partnership with the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Culture and Knowledge Development, among others.





# Looking Forward: Plans for 2019


