

Pediatric Endocrinologist Assistant, Associate or Full Professor

The University of California, San Diego (UCSD), Department of Pediatrics (http://www-pediatrics.ucsd.edu), and Rady Children's Specialists of San Diego, a Medical Foundation (http://www.rchsd.org) are committed to academic excellence and diversity within the faculty, staff, and student body.

The hospital is an approximately 505-bed facility which serves as a major regional tertiary care hospital for children and is the major teaching facility for the Department of Pediatrics of the UCSD School of Medicine.

The Department is recruiting full-time pediatric endocrinologists for the Division of Pediatric Endocrinology of the Department of Pediatrics and Rady Children's Hospital-San Diego. Opportunities exist to collaborate with divisional faculty and with clinical and basic science investigators in other departments.

The Pediatric Endocrinology/Diabetes service at Rady Children's, which is consistently ranked by U.S. News & World Report as one of the best programs in the nation, is currently staffed by 11 providers with continued growth expected. We average 18,000 outpatient visits per year, including over 1,700 children with diabetes from San Diego, Riverside and Imperial counties. Multidisciplinary Specialty clinics include: Turner syndrome, Disorders of Sexual Development, Cystic Fibrosis Related Diabetes, Prader-Willi syndrome, Lipid disorders, Post-Transplant Diabetes, Transgender.

This position is expected to participate or lead in teaching, mentoring, research or service towards building an equitable and diverse scholarly environment.

Candidates must have an MD or MD/PhD or equivalent in in Health Related fields and must have or be eligible for a California medical license or equivalent certification/permit as determined by the Medical Board of California. Candidates with an MD must be Board Certified/Board Eligible in Pediatric Endocrinology.

The appropriate series and appointment at the Assistant, Associate or Full Professor level will be based on the candidate's qualifications and experience.
