





 - 27% urban, 27% rural, 45% suburban








Grade-Level Implementation

Current 2020–2021 Participants

- Majority of respondents are delivering the curriculum to either eighth graders only or both seventh and eighth graders.
 - 36 (77%) eighth only or seventh and eighth graders
 - 7 (15%) are teaching the curriculum to sixth graders



Semester vs. Yearlong Implementation


Current 2020–2021 Participants

A slight majority of respondents are delivering the curriculum within a semester-long model, but implementation varies widely by both grade level and timing.

- (17%) teaching only one semester, fall or spring
- 17 (36%) teaching both semesters
- 16 (34%) teaching full year
- 6 (13%) teaching combination (one or both semesters for some grades, all year for others)


Stand-Alone or Stacked Implementation

Who is teaching Texas OnCourse? Current 2020–2021 Participants

- CCMR or advisory instructors are majority
- Subject area was any core subject
- Counselors
- Other (instructional coaches, school leaders, etc.)



So, what are they saying?

93% agreed or strongly agreed that overall, they felt prepared to teach the lessons they have delivered so far.

79% agreed or strongly agreed that overall, the Academy modules have been valuable in supporting CCMR curriculum.

Middle School College and Career Curriculum

- Writing Curriculum
 - Texas OnCourse Middle School course guide **update this every summer**
 - Lesson plans, additional resources listed, and extension activities
 - Two 45-minute lessons per week
 - Powtoon videos
- We put together seven to eight weeks of lessons for our eighth graders. We start with the very basics and build: understanding college and career readiness, interest profiles, graduation requirements, Distinguished Level of Achievement, our KISD endorsements, and pathways.
- We use **Eduthings** for interest profiles, four-year planning, and registration.
- For the last two years we've given the College and Career Knowledge Assessment before and after teaching.

Middle School College and Career Curriculum

- HB5 curriculum delivered in seven or eight modules through eighth grade advisory classes fall semester
 - Train advisory teachers on HB5 curriculum
 - Tour of Keller Center for Advanced Learning (KCAL)
 - High school showcase events (four campuses)
 - CTE Expo
- End product: ninth grade registration and complete four-year plan for every eighth grader by the end of January
- **This year:** We gave the CCKA for educators to all district counselors and CTE, advisory, and AVID teachers. We added all high school CTE and AVID students to the CCKA for students.

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What have we learned?

- Four-year plan completion has drastically improved
- Parent involvement has increased
 - Weekly emails (sent from district level)
 - Showcase nights
- Increased staff knowledge of CCMR due to Texas OnCourse Academy
- Buy-in and accountability from campus administrators
- Use a specific CCMR class if possible (we use advisory)
- Challenges
 - COVID
 - New SIS

Middle School and High School College and Career Curriculum Plans for next year:

- Back to in-person learning!
- This summer update HB5 curriculum for both seventh and eighth grade and possibly extend beyond the seven or eight weeks
- Create virtual version of HB5 curriculum for potential virtual academy
- Use the new CCMR coaches at each high school campus on middle school campuses to help with HB5 and CCMR education
- Continue to encourage educators to complete Texas OnCourse Academy modules
- Letting CCKA for educators drive professional development plans
