


Recent research from McKinsey & Co suggests **executives could close racial gaps** within their ranks **by being more strategic about geographic locations**.




Nearly 56.5% of the Black workforce is concentrated in the South.

The Black labor force is not located in the fastest growing regions, nor are they located in the regions with the highest anticipated job growth thru 2030.

Transportation, which anchors the Memphis economy, is the **highest paying industry for Black workers** across the US. It is also at highest risk for automation.


Employers struggle to identify diverse IT talent.




The Digital City project connects residents to digital access in South City






