


#### MCA History

- was created in 2001 as the primary POA for the operation and maintenance of the Community
- ➤ is regulated through the State of Colorado (CCIOA Statutes)
- ➤ became self managed organization in 2006
- became a 501(c)4 Non-profit organization in 2008
- ➤ continues to be the fastest growing community in Colorado and the largest in city of Denver
- ➤ Developer Control Period ends in 2022



#### **BOUNDARY & FACILITIES**



- Our boundary is the 4500 acre historic airport site.
- We provide for the operation, maintenance, improvement and replacement of all assets owned by PCMD
- We produce a full range of diverse community programming
- We are responsible to enforce community covenants, policies and rules

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#### PARKS, PARKWAYS & OPEN SPACE



- Maintains 60 Parks & Parkways (250+ acres)
- Maintains Medians, Alleys & Bridges
- Provides snow removal on public spaces
- Maintains pedestrian lighting & park structures
- Provides trash removal, recycling & dog stations
- Manages mosquito control program
- Manages storm water facilities
- Makes continuous park improvements



#### **POOLS & AQUATICS**



- Operates 7 outdoor pools
- Hires & trains 150 seasonal staff
- Provides learn to swim programs
- Provides competitive and recreational swim programs
- Rents facilities for "after hour" events and parties.
- Makes continuous pool facility improvements

#### MCA Provides Rules & Policies for:

- Community Parks
- Community Pools
- Community Alleys



#### The MCA DOES NOT Enforce

- Restrictive rules on private property
- Neighbor vs. Neighbor issues (except in alley)
- Speed limits & Parking on Denver owned streets
- Animal Control issues
- Anything related to a DPR park or facility
- Best Resource to solve is Denver 311



#### Community Identity & Name

- Article 1 of the Community Declaration (CCR's) sets forth the name of the Community as "Stapleton" (after the former Airport site which it is located)
- CCR's also gave the MCA Delegates the sole authority to put forth (at anytime within 20 years) a new name of the community and refer it to the Executive Board & Developer to be adopted.



#### 2019 Name Referendum

- 10,550 ballots sent to members
- 3,590 ballots returned or 34% participation
- 35% supported removing the name
   "Supported removing the name of a Mayor with verified ties to the KKK"
- 65% supported retaining the name
   "Supported retaining the name of a beloved airport with historic ties to the success of Denver"
- 80% supported NOT spending additional funds
- 5,275 members were necessary to support amending CCR's to restrict the name change process (question 3)




#### **2020 Name Change Initiative**

- Followed the killing of George Floyd
- Sparked a national conversation of Names and Monuments
- MCA dropped the use of the Stapleton badge on its logo, signs & website
- MCA delegates move to revisit the name controversy
- MCA delegates supported the community naming process announced by SUN
- Name adopted by the MCA Board of Directors (Aug 20)
- Name adopted by the Developer Brookfield (Aug 20)
- Central Park was inserted and recorded into the Community CCR's Article 1 (Aug 2020)







#### DISTRICT DELEGATE ELECTION




#### What is a Delegate

- is elected annually
- represents approx. 800 1200 households
- serves as primary advisory committee to MCA board & staff
- meets monthly with MCA staff
- meets quarterly with the MCA executive board
- ratifies the annual budget and assessment schedule
- elects all open executive board seats
- serves on design review and compliance committees











#### REVENUE HISTORY & FORECAST













#### 2021 CORE SPENDING
