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KID'S MINISTRY TODAY

The impacts of COVID-19 have profoundly impacted our children's ministries. A recent survey from the Children's Pastors Only Facebook group found that 77% of Kid's Ministries remain closed, 21% are open with restrictions, and only 2% have fully reopened.

Equally disruptive is the fact that many states are extending/expanding their social distancing requirements through the summer and into the fall. Kids' Ministries are coming to terms with the reality that when summer ends their classes will not be able to reopen.

Note: In the next section "Tips & Tricks" we'll discuss some best practices for filming and assembling your final lesson video. Now that you've reviewed what you'll be building, let's talk about how you'll build it. This section will cover two big ideas:

- **Shooting Video:** Getting the best video content from your team.
- Editing Video: Assembling a finished video that your kids will love.

SHOOTING VIDEO

Here's the good news, anyone on your team that has a mobile phone/device can contribute to your online video! To get the best out of your team's videos here are some recommendations:

Always Shoot Horizontal: While we tend to hold our phones vertically, video is best shot in horizontal. Remind your team to turn their phones sideways when filming.

Ready, Steady, Go! To avoid giving your kids motion sickness have teachers use a tripod or some other method to keep their phone steady while filming.

Be Expressive & Have Fun: Personality doesn't always translate over video. Encourage your team to be silly, expressive, and fun during their videos.

Keep it Short & Sweet: Sometimes services run long, and so your team may be accustomed to stretching things out a bit. While it may work in person...the stretching just makes videos boring. Encourage your team to keep things short. Remember, your total video should only be 20-30 minutes long.

Test for Lighting and Sound: You can do a lot in video editing software but you can't fix bad lighting or sound. Have your team do a short 10-15 second video on their phone to see if their sound is coming through and the scene is well lit. Then

make adjustments as necessary. You want to find out that you have a problem on the test video, not after the perfect take.

Upload After Your Done: Finally instruct your team where they should upload their videos once they are finished. We'll discuss file management further in the "Get Organized" section of this ebook.

EDITING VIDEO

To assemble your lesson video, you will need a video editing software. You can use iMovie, Camtasia, or Adobe Premiere. If you are looking for a great free option, we recommend FXhome. We've put together this great walkthrough video that shows how to assemble your video in Adobe Premiere. However, the basic principles we share can be used in most video editing softwares. Additionally, here are some helpful tips when assembling your Bible lesson video:

- 1. Have a solid script: The most important thing you can do to ensure a great video is to stick to the template we've provided (with any modification you make). Sticking to the script helps ensure that your video editing is quick and efficient.
- 2. Keep your files organized: You want your video editor editing, not searching for files. Set this role up for success by making sure every file on your script is clearly labeled and organized in a central location. More on this in the "Get Organized" section of this Ebook.
- **3. Focus on transitions:** Just like they are in the classroom, transitions are a big component of your lesson video. Look for different sound effects that you can use when the memory verse or teaching starts. These elements are fun for kids and help keep them attentive throughout your lesson. Just remember they can be overused!

4. Allow Time for Rendering & Upload: Building your video in an editing software is just the first step of completing your video. Next you have to render the video into a final format like MP4 so that everyone can view it. This rendering process can take hours, so make sure you have allowed for this time in your production schedule. Additionally, when uploading your video to Facebook or YouTube it can take time for the video to be processed. Make sure there is a cushion in your production schedule so that your video can be viewed on time by your kids.

5. Double-Check the Final Video: Sometimes errors occur in the rendering process. A video can have the sound drop out halfway through or be missing the last 10 minutes of your lesson. It's good to have someone watch the entire video before uploading, to check for any errors that have occurred.



When putting together an online Bible lesson, you and your team are the essential resource. This section will focus on getting your team organized so that you can effectively and efficiently start building your lessons.

1) THE KICK-OFF MEETING

There's an old adage (often attributed to Benjamin Franklin) that says "Failing to plan is planning to fail." Your kick-off meeting is your opportunity to share why you will be building online Bible lessons, who will be participating, and how your lesson videos will be assembled and shared.

• **Note:** We will provide an outline for your Kick-Off Meeting later in this book.

Begin by inviting your team to an online (we recommend Zoom) meeting. This meeting needs to be short, purposeful, and allow room for questions and comments. Below is an overview of what you will cover with your team:

Why are we building online Bible lessons? With the uncertainty surrounding COVID-19 we must stay engaged with our kids. Every week we want them to see the faces of the teachers that love them and experience an exciting gospel presentation. Additionally, these Bible videos can be viewed both at home and in our classrooms as we reopen. If our church moves forward with an additional service with smaller classes, these videos can be an amazing tool that existing or new volunteers can successfully use.

Who will be participating? Creating online Bible lessons will require the right people in the right roles. Ideally you want to spread this out across a team so that one person doesn't have to do it all (burnout is real)! On the following page is a list of roles and responsibilities for your team:

Video Editing: Will use an editing software like iMovie to assemble all digital elements into a final video. This is a big role and will require great file management.

File Management: Organizes and labels all video files in a single folder. Additionally, they will work with other roles to ensure that all files are uploaded correctly and on time.

Announcements/Transitions: This is a great role for the Kids Pastor/Director. They will keep families up to date with church announcements and introduce other leaders.

Memory Verse: Opens and closes your service with a memory verse. We recommend some silly hand motions to keep things fun and engaging for your kids.

Wiggle Time: This person will lead your class in a short (but necessary) session of movement and stretching.

Bible Reading: Before your teaching, read Scripture to your children. Think about using a translation that can be easily understood by kids.

Lesson Teaching: This role will share a short and engaging Bible teaching. It's important to remember that, with video, shorter is better than longer. So keep your teaching simple and to the point.

Closing Prayer/Announcements: End your service praying over everything you've discussed. Then, share any follow up announcements or activities for families.

2) CREATING A PRODUCTION SCHEDULE

After your Kick-Off meeting, the next step is creating your production schedule. If you have a clear plan to assign tasks and organize files you'll be surprised at how easily your online Bible lessons will come together. Your production schedule will ensure that your team feels prepared and productive!

Assigning Tasks: Later in the document we'll provide you with a customizable lesson scheduling template. This template will include the date of the service, an online lesson plan, a list of responsibilities, a section to assign team members, due dates, and instructions on where to upload files. This tool will ensure that your team knows what they're doing and when. Here are some things to consider:

Plan Ahead: You'll want to schedule your team 3-4 weeks out. Approach your video scheduling just like your classroom scheduling. Your team has busy schedules so give them the freedom to choose dates that work best for them.

Due Dates: The key to your production schedule working is your team submitting files on time so that you have time to edit and upload your final video. Here is what we recommend:

- Monday: Reminders are sent that all videos and graphics are due Wednesday.
- Wednesday: All videos and graphics are uploaded and correctly labeled.
- Friday: Final video has been edited and rendered
- Saturday: Video is uploaded to social channel with a premier date set
- Sunday: Video is published to Facebook, Youtube, and your website.

Managing Files: To successfully create your online kids Bible lessons each week you want a centralized location to manage your files, such as **Google Drive** or **Box.com**. Without it you'll be sifting through emails and texts trying to figure out who sent you what. When managing your files online, here are some things to keep in mind:

- Drive Size: Video files can be quite large, so make sure you have enough space on your drive. A free Google Drive account has 15 GB of storage which is plenty!
- Drive Access: You'll want your team to have access to your drive so that they can upload their files. Create a folder on your drive titled "Online Bible Lessons." Share this folder with everyone on your team so that they have upload access. Here's some info about **Google Drive Share Settings**.



- Sub-Folders: Inside your main "Online Bible Lessons" folder create sub folders for upcoming Bible lessons. Your lesson folders should include the lesson date and name. For example "August 2 - The Creation Story" or "August 9 - Cain & Abel." This labeling will help your team as you schedule out multiple weeks in advance.
- File Naming: We recommend labeling each file by the order that they will appear in your video including a clear description of what the file is. For example, "1. Bible Quiz Video.mp4," "2. Announcements.mp4," "3. Lesson Introduction.mp4" and so on.

Whether your service is digital or in person, connecting with parents is key. The ideal way to end your service is by equipping parents to continue your lesson at home. However, COVID-19 has increased most parents' workload, so your goal needs to be equipping parents without increasing their to-do list.

Every Sharefaith Kids lesson includes a family devotional and activity pages that are fun for kids and easy for parents. These resources make it easy for parents to partner with you. At the end of your lesson talk to your parents directly. Point them to your lesson's family devotional. Remind them that this resource includes the Bible story video, Scripture reading, interactive discussion questions, and a host of printable activity pages.


HOW DO PARENTS GET TO THE FAMILY DEVOTIONAL?

1. Coloring Pages: On the bottom of each lesson's coloring page there is a QR/ Unlock Code. Parents can scan the QR code or go to the url families.sharefaith.com and enter the 6-digit unlock code.

- 2. Custom Slide: When you download the PDF of your lesson's coloring page you'll find the QR/Unlock code in the bottom right corner. Take a screenshot of the Family Devotional box and then drop it in a slide at the end of your video. Parents can scan the code from your video or find the unlock code.

- 3. Direct Link: An active membership is required for devotional access, because of this family devotionals can only be accessed with a member's unique 6-digit access code. However, if you are a Sharefaith member and would like to send families a direct url link to any devotional, this tutorial will show you how!

For churches that are reopening there are some difficult challenges:

- To maintain social distancing, classroom sizes must be smaller.
- Smaller classroom sizes require more services.
- More services require additional volunteers.

A great solution to these challenges is a hybrid service. In this model, you use the digital lesson video you created as the centerpiece of an in-person kid's service. This option carries with it some powerful benefits:

- 1. You're not building two separate services. The video you create can work online or in person. This keeps your team working efficiently.
- 2. You're giving your volunteers a great tool. By having a 20-30 minute video they can show in class, you allow newer volunteers to simply focus on the opening and closing of service.
- 3. You're planning for distance learning. Maintaining social distancing during a lesson can be challenging, but a strong video presentation along with a smart classroom setup can make a huge difference.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

Our suggested hybrid service model plans for an hour-long service. This service involves a volunteer opening and closing the service with your digital bible lesson shown in between. On the following page we'll include a template for your hybrid Sunday School service.

1 HOUR HYBRID BIBLE LESSON

WELCOME (5 minutes)

- Welcome kids to class
- Review classroom expectations

HI-LOW (10 minutes)

• Hi-Low is a great way to touch base with your kids and see how they're doing. Encourage each child to say their name and then share the best (hi) and worst (low) thing that happened to them over the last week. Let this conversation roll! Kids are craving social interaction and this provides a great opportunity.

VIDEO LESSON (30 Minutes)



ACTIVITY PAGES (10 Minutes)

• Pass out the Sharefaith Kids lesson activity pages to each child. Every lesson comes with coloring pages, word searches, Bible Mazes, crossword puzzles, spot the difference, and more.

CLOSING (5 Minutes)

- Remind children that their coloring pages come with a link to a family devotional.
- Give children the opportunity to share prayer requests.
- Pray over your children and then dismiss them to parents.
