College Credit Plus Overview



- Opportunity for college-ready students in Non-Public schools, in grades 7-12 to take college courses for no cost/reduced cost. Contingent upon completing the process to apply for funding and receiving approval for funding.
- Students can choose any course that is part of a degree or certificate program.



High School and/or College Credit

- ► CCP can satisfy or supplement graduation required courses.
- ► 3+ credit hour college course = 1 HS Carnegie unit.
- Official college transcripts must be requested by student to send to another college for transfer.





Tuition

- If you apply for funding through the state and are approved, tuition is free for the amount of hours your student is awarded. Please apply for 30 hours.
- Private colleges may charge families.
- ▶ Students who do not earn credit, pay for their own college tuition.
- Lehman tuition is not decreased for partial enrollment.





At Lehman and On-Campus

- Courses can be taken at Lehman (approximately 100 credit hours on campus)
- Courses can be taken on a college campus if it fits into their high school schedule (transportation must be provided by the family).
 - *Side Note- Because Lehman offers approximently100 credit hours options for CCP, 99% of our students take all of their CCP courses on Lehman campus
- Courses can also be taken on-line with prior approval of the principal and school counselor

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS COURSES

The courses listed below can be taken by eligible Lehman Catholic students to earn college credits while attending high school. Taken at Lehman Catholic, online or at local universities / colleges, these courses give our students a jump-start on their college coursework. The courses range from one to five credit hours and may transfer to other universities or colleges. These courses are tentative and subject to change.

Qualifying GPA replaces Placement Testing for 2022-23 (pending state approval)

- 1. After you apply to <u>www.edisonohio.edu/getstarted</u>
- 2. Establish eligibility:
 - a. Submit HS transcript which reflects program eligibility criteria
 - College-level ACT- English 18, Reading 22, & Math 22 or SAT scores
 - 3.0 HS cumulative GPA* (GPA as eligibility standard is pending state approval – check for updates at the end of February)
 - b. Schedule a time to take the ACCUPLACER at Edison State –if GPA does not qualify

College Credit Plus at Edison State

College Credit Plus (CCP) provides participating students with the opportunity to earn college and high school credit concurrently, accelerating their college careers while reducing the time and cost of college attendance after high school.

Ready to Get Started? Follow the Steps Below.

SUBMIT a Letter of Intent Students must submit a Letter of Intent to their high school before April 1st. This letter informs the school district of the student's intent to participate in the CCP program for the following school year. The school district distributes the Letters of Intent. See your high school guidance counselor for additional information.



Apply Online

New CCP students, including those taking courses only at their high school, must submit an online application. Returning CCP students are not required to reapply. The application must be submitted two weeks before testing.



Qualify

Submit qualifying high school transcript or schedule an ACCUPLACER assessment to gain admission to the program. Eligibility criteria and admission updates can be found at the website below.



Submit Questionnaire

After receiving program acceptance, complete a mature content questionnaire before in enrolling in courses.



Register for Classes

Students must consult with their guidance counselor to sign up for Edison State courses offered on campus, online, or at select high schools. A registration form must be submitted for each semester of participation.



Attend Orientation

New CCP students are required to attend orientation to learn about important Edison State policies and procedures. The online orientation module in Blackboard will become available after first course registration is completed.

*NOTE Students attending a non-public high school or homeschool must apply to the Ohio Department of Education to receive funding for courses. Visit www.ohiohighered.org/ccp for more information and details about deadlines that could impact funding opportunities.

For optimal course selection and registration, it is strongly recommended that prospective CCP students complete the admission and assessment steps by the timeline outlined below:

Summer Registration—Submit all admission materials by May 1.
Fall Registration—Submit all admission materials by May 1.
Spring Registration—Submit all admission materials by November 1.

NOTE: These are suggested timelines, not deadlines. Admissions for Edison State CCP is on-going. Please be advised, while Edison State does not have a specific admission deadline; your high school may have strict deadlines. You are responsible for ensuring you have met any criteria imposed by your high school to be eligible to participate in CCP.

New Mature Content Questionnaire

- As a student eligible to participate in **College Credit Plus** and admitted to Edison State Community College, you will be enrolling in <u>actual</u> <u>college courses</u>, which <u>may</u> include "mature subject matter" as defined in Ohio Revised Code 3365.035.
- Both a parent and student will complete a form stating their consent in regards to mature content that can be covered in a class, regardless of the location of where the course is taught (Lehman) <u>Mature Content</u> <u>Acknowledgement form</u>
- ▶ Here you will find the <u>new legislation</u> to make you aware of the guidelines, your rights, and expectations when completing a CCP course.
- Since it is a CCP class, our teachers are subject to follow the same syllabus and content as the Edison course.
- ▶ Parents and students will need to inform themselves on the course descriptions and content for the Edison/CCP class using the Edison link to course descriptions.

Edison Prerequisite

- ▶ You were emailed a form and it lists the Edison prerequisites for all of our courses.
- Please review this list before you consider having your student take a CCP course at Lehman
- ▶ If the student does not meet the Edison pre-reqs, they will not be able to enroll in the course as CCP.
- ▶ Students have to receive a 3.0 GPA in some subject areas in order to take a course- example- Pre-Calculus MTH 128S at Edison. Or AP English ENG-121S at Edison.

First Year CCP Student Acceptance Letters from Edison

- Once accepted, Edison will send you a letter of acceptance. You will be required to upload a Letter of Acceptance into the OH-ID portal by <u>April 1st</u>
- ► The Letter of Acceptance will be <u>emailed</u> to you from Edison when transcripts or coursework is reviewed and a 3.0 GPA unweighted is acquired (pending state approval).
- ▶ Please watch your <u>email</u> you used to APPLY to Edison- This is where you email will be sent.

Returning CCP Students

- You will be required to upload a "Letter of Good Standing" to your CCP Funding Application
- Your letter will be sent to you from Edison via <u>email</u> and a copy of the letter will be mailed the first week of <u>March</u>.
- You will not be able to submit your funding application if you do not upload your letter of good standing.
- ▶ If you created an OH-ID log in(previously SAFE Account) you are still in the system for the 22-23 year
- You do not have to create a new OH/ID each year you complete the funding application
- ▶ If you have forgotten your OH-ID (previously SAFE Account) username and password, please follow the steps to retrieve that information

OH ID Account

Can be done at any time!

A parent/guardian must create an OH|ID account at https://ohid.ohio.gov.

Please note: If you already have an OH|ID account you do not need to create a new one. Please allow a few business days for this account to be generated.

Application Access

A parent/guardian must log-in to the OH|ID account and request access to the CCP funding application.

The application will be available in early February 2022.

Intent Form

Deadline: April 1, 2022

A parent/guardian must log-in to the OH|ID account and complete the Intent to Participate Section.

The Intent to Participate form is part of the funding application.

4

Complete and Submit Application

Deadline: April 1, 2022

Sign into your OH|ID account, access the CCP funding application, and do the following:

- Complete each section of the funding application
- Upload requested documents
- SUBMIT the application before the deadline!

(No exceptions and no extensions are available.)

Students must apply and be admitted to a college prior to applying for funding. Families will be required to upload the college admission letter in the funding application. Additional details, including application windows and deadlines, will be available at www.ohiohighered.org/ccp/students-families in February 2022.

Make sure when you follow these steps-you have your CCP **Funding Application** Manual open to review the step by step directions. I suggest using two devicesone to complete the application and another device to view the manual step by step directions

Items to Collect for Funding Application

- AFIER YOU HAVE RECEIVED YOUR STUDENTS ACCEPTANCE(new student) or GOOD STANDING (returning CCP students) LETTER
- You should have the following items with you when you sit down to complete your funding application on the SAFE Account
 - ▶ 1. College Credit Plus Funding Application Manual- YOU MUST FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS vs. emailing myself or Mrs. Shirey and asking what you need to do next;)
 - ► This provides STEP BY STEP instructions
 - ▶ 2. College Acceptance Letter New CCP Students- Edison will email you after your transcript has been reviewed and you have obtained a 3.0 or higher GPA. Returning CCP students- have your Letter of Good Standing- sent from Edison via email and regular mail by the first week of March.
 - ▶ 2. Driver License- <u>not</u> your student's driver license
 - ▶ 3. Total credit hours your student is planning to take for the 2022-23 school year. Apply for 30 hours. Summer 2022 Spring 2023. Student Registration for online courses taking place 3rd week of February.
 - ▶ Just state your student is planning for 30 credit hours. It makes the process so much easier on all involved

CCP Funding Application Tips

- You the parent sign up for the OH/ID account. NOT THE STUDENT!!!!!!!
 - ▶ If you create a student account you will have to call support to correct this.
- ► The Letter of Intent is a step in the Funding Application for Non-Public students and is not a separate form you need to fill out (like in previous years).
- Make sure you list the correct grade for your student.
 - ▶ The funding application is for the 2022-23 school year. You must list the grade your student will be entering for 2022-23 school year.
- Double check that you have listed the correct amount of total credit hours you are requesting for the year. (30 hours)
- You may be required to verify your account via email after you enter your information.
- You MUST hit the SUBMIT button at the end of the application
 - ▶ You know your application is received by logging into your account and looking at your application status. It will say submitted.

Advanced Placement (AP)

- ► AP
 - ▶ College Level
 - ▶ Can be used for "credit by exam"
 - ▶ Test score, not grade determines credit
 - ▶ Year Long
 - ▶ Standard Curriculum provided from the College Board
 - ▶ Good for out-of-state, highly selective
 - ▶ In our experience, <u>some</u> private schools & out of state schools tend to favor AP courses over CCP

Potential changes coming to Lehman AP program

- CCP Law states a school is not able to teach an AP course and a CCP course simultaneously, which forces us to make some changes to AP and/or CCP courses being offered
- Lehman is in the process of determining if any of our courses should be only AP and/or only CCP
- These decisions must be made quickly and will be communicated to you by registration dates for current students (March)
- ▶ AP Courses will only affect juniors and seniors for the 2022-23 school year
- Regardless if we offer a class as AP, a student can take an AP exam per CollegeBoard rules
- The student will have access to the AP course material via CollegeBoard

Make the Right Choice for your Child

- School Concerns
 - College Courses mean College Responsibility
 - Grade(s) on a college transcript
 - Not a pathway for early graduation. It can be a cost savings, but still are required to complete 4 years of high school.
- Transferring Credits
 - All Ohio Public Universities/Colleges have to take the credit, but they do not have to apply it to a degree.
 - Courses that are TAG courses mean students are guaranteed the transfer of applicable credits among Ohio's <u>public</u> colleges and universities and equitable treatment in the application of credits to degree requirements. i.e. BIO 121S will transfer in as a Biology course at OSU
 - Some private colleges may not participate in CCP which means your credits may or may not transfer; one example is the University of Dayton who treats some courses as transfer courses.

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Requirements

- ▶ The following courses need to be taken on our campus and credits earned at Lehman in order to be eligible for valedictorian/salutatorian.
 - ▶ 4 credits of Religion, 4 credits of English, 4 credits of Math, 3 credits of Science, US History, and Government

Program Options

Students wishing to complete the biomolecular focus will substitute Biochemistry 4511 in place of Chemistry 2520.

Acceptance Criteria

Acceptance into this program is based on the eligibility point hour ratio (EPHR) of Math 1151, 1172; Engineering 1181.xx, 1182.xx; and Chemistry 1210, 1220. A minimum 2.7 cumulative point hour ratio (CPHR) and EPHR is required and admission is competitive. Applications are accepted during Autumn Term and Spring Term by the third Friday.
