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KITCHEN MEASUREMENT GUIDE

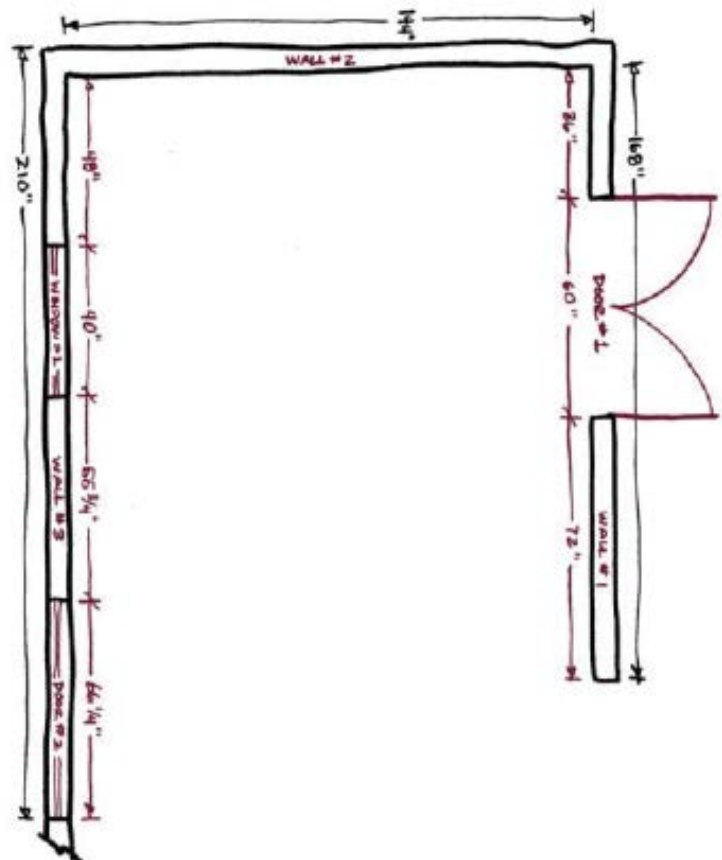
Taking your own measurements doesn't have to be complicated. By taking this step now, we can save a lot of time and we can price your project more accurately. We've provided the graph paper, so grab a pencil and measuring tape and follow the simple steps below to get us started!

STEP 1 – Draw a Basic Outline of Your Existing Kitchen On The Graph Paper Provided

- Draw the walls of your kitchen on the graph paper provided.
- Do not draw your cabinets in the diagram, just walls, windows & doors
- Draw the location of each window & door
- Note which way the door swings
- Label & number each wall on the drawing

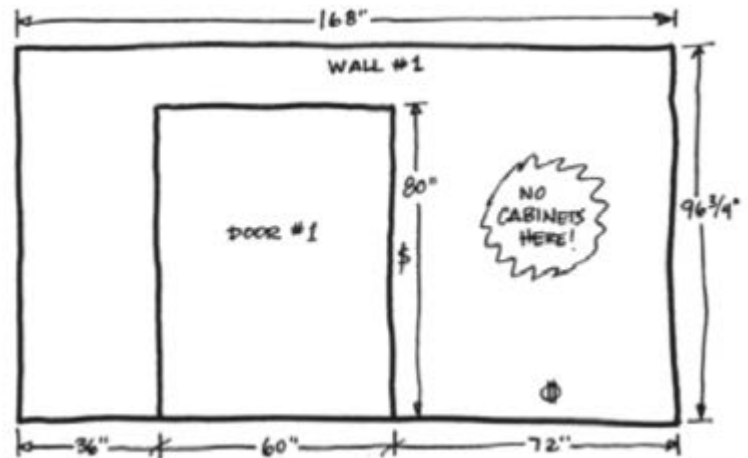
STEP 2 – Take Measurements of the Room

- Get Total Dimensions for the Room – Walls Only
- Measure the Total Length of each wall (corner to corner) and note it on the graph paper (round to the nearest 1/2" inch)
- Provide Dimensions of Existing walls only....not any planned modifications
- Measure the location of each window & door opening measuring from outside edge of trim to outside edge of trim



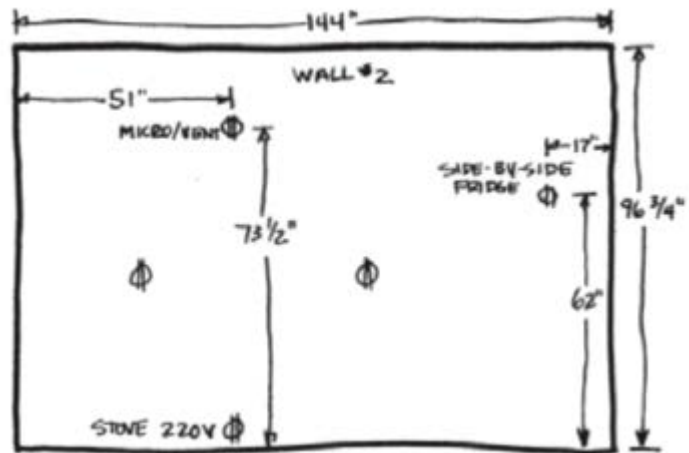
STEP 3 – Draw a Basic Elevation of Each Wall of Your Existing Kitchen on the Graph Paper Provided

- Use a new piece of graph paper for each wall - Label & number the wall as displayed on the outline of the kitchen
- Draw the location of each window & door opening
- Note all electrical switches, outlets, gas lines, drains, etc. (Use the universal symbols guide below to mark each location)



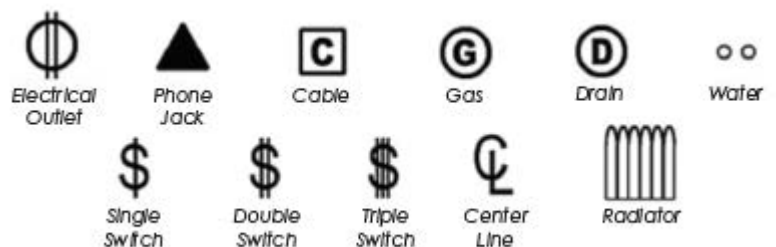
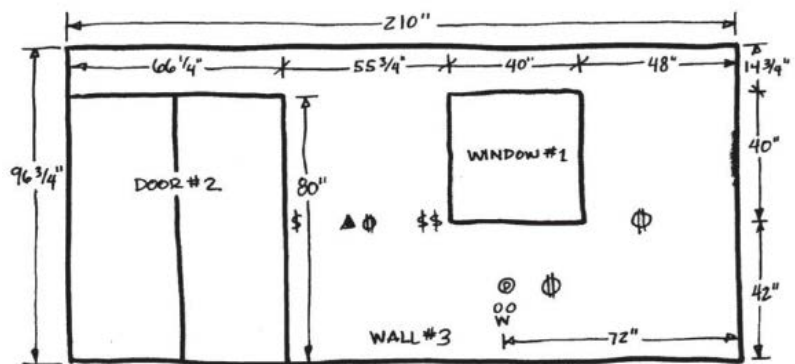
STEP 4 – Take Measurements of the Openings

- Measure the finished ceiling height, overall room width, soffits (if applicable) and any suspended light fixture that may interfere with the design (round to the nearest 1/2 inch)
- Measure the location of each window & door opening measuring from outside edge of trim to outside edge of trim (round to the nearest 1/2 inch)



STEP 5 – Take Pictures

- Take a picture of each wall in your kitchen
- Start at one wall and take pictures moving clockwise until you come back to the original position
- If you can't get the whole wall in one picture, start at the left side and move right (overlapping the pictures approximately 1/2 the width of a cabinet with the previous image)
- Take several "wide shot" pictures of the kitchen from several angles
- Take any additional pictures you think might be relevant / helpful
