its community building role and with its
"inclusive" objectives.

AUSTSWIM accredited teachers™ continue to be the accepted standard and benchmark for the industry, government and the community. The evidence for this recognition can be no more strongly evidenced than in AUSTSWIM Teachers being insured as part of their accreditation. The partnership with Water Safety New Zealand continues to gain momentum and bring AUSTSWIM Training, Accreditation and Licensing to New Zealand. The inclusion of Public Liability and Professional Indemnity Insurance in the Teacher Accreditation is unique and exemplifies AUSTSWIM's support for quality education and training practices.



### AUSTSWIM TEACHER OF AQUATICS – ACCESS AND INCLUSION

Eagerly anticipated by all, AUSTSWIM was excited to announce early in 2013 that the new AUSTSWIM Teacher of Aquatics – Access and Inclusion course was readu.

The AUSTSWIM Teacher of Aquatics – Access and Inclusion (TAI) course is designed to provide the knowledge and information required to deliver programs and services that meet the needs of a diverse range of people who use the aquatic environment.

Originally known as AUSTSWIM
Teacher of Aquatics for People with a
Disability (PWD), this course has been
updated and extended to reflect the
growing size and diversity of today's
communities. AUSTSWIM Teacher
of Aquatics – Access and Inclusion
adopts an educational approach and
provides a positive directive to provide
aquatics access and inclusion to all
people regardless of: disability, chronic
condition, age or cultural and linguistic
diverse backgrounds (CALD).

Presenter training workshops were conducted throughout the year, with approximately 65 presenters attending these opportunities. AUSTSWIM thanks and acknowledges the contributions by presenters in shaping the course resources to become what they are today.

### **AUSTSWIM ASSESSOR**

Late in 2012, AUSTSWIM introduced the AUSTSWIM Assessor Online Module. This module was specifically designed to guide teachers through all aspects of the AUSTSWIM Assessor role, which is to assess the teaching competency of trainee AUSTSWIM teachers after they have gained an appropriate amount of experience under the supervision of their Training Supervisor/s.

In order for AUSTSWIM Teachers to be eligible to assess a trainee teacher's competency, they are required to undertake and complete this Online Module. Since being phased in, the AUSTSWIM Assessor system has been well received throughout Australia and internationally.

The Online Module is FREE of charge and gives AUSTSWIM Teachers an automatic 2 hours of professional development towards their AUSTSWIM Teacher licence renewal (minimum requirements are required to apply).

AUSTSWIM is very appreciative of the enormous contribution of the Assessors, who volunteer their time to assist candidates through to completion of their AUSTSWIM Teacher Licence<sup>TM</sup>.

### PRESENTER TRAINING

Throughout the 2012-2013 year, of new presenters to our team through presenter training opportunities in Australia and internationally. Notably this year opportunities were available in New Zealand, South Korea, Malaysia and Vietnam. AUSTSWIM is working closely with our international partners in order to support the development of swimming and water safety skills and knowledge within local communities. A vital part of this process involves training local course presenters, who will be able to train an ever increasing number of teachers of swimming and water safety.

Presenter workshops were conducted throughout the year; high participation levels and great sharing of knowledge and information meant the workshops were very successful and well received by all involved.

### AUSTSWIM TEACHER OF SWIMMING AND WATER SAFETY

From October 2012, AUSTSWIM introduced changes to the personal rescue competency session of the Teacher of Swimming and Water Safety course. A notable addition to the course was video material from the RLSSA Bronze Medallion DVD. This video footage was kindly supplied by the Royal Life Saving Society – Australia. AUSTSWIM would like to acknowledge the support of RLSSA in making these resources available for use during AUSTSWIM courses.

### INTERNATIONAL

## AUSTSWIM CONTINUES TO WORK TOWARDS BUILDING STRONGER LOCAL PARTNERSHIPS IN PROVIDING ADVOCACY, ADVICE AND TRAINING TO MANY COUNTRIES OVERSEAS.

Over the 12 months AUSTSWIM has delivered over 50 courses internationally in Beijing, China, Dubai, Hong Kong, Korea, Malaysia, Qatar, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Korea and New Zealand.

The demand for quality training courses and accredited AUSTSWIM Licensed teachers throughout these countries continues to be evident with there being a need to have accredited swimming and water safety teachers in place to deliver quality learn to swim and water safety programs and education in these communities.

### DUBAI

AUSTSWIM has been offering accredited training in Dubai and Qatar since 2008. Opportunities for training continue through a partnership with AISS in Dubai and with the support of AusTrade. As a result of this partnership there are increasingly more opportunities for the community to gain access to AUSTSWIM accredited training.

Work has commenced with training 5 Korean AUSTSWIM Presenters to deliver the AUSTSWIM training to the Korean community. The AUSTSWIM training materials are being translated to Korean and will be ready for release early 2014.

#### **SINGAPORE**

AUSTSWIM continues to be actively involved in the delivery of AUSTSWIM training in Singapore through the continued commitment of Ted Tullberg, AUSTSWM representative.

#### VIETNAM

AUSTSWIM continues to work in conjunction with two charity organisations – Swim Vietnam and Water Safety Vietnam. Both programs Share the common goal of promoting the importance of swimming and water safety within the local communities.

Swim Vietnam is a charity based in Hoi An, Central Vietnam, which provides free lessons for Vietnamese children and trains local adults as swimming and water safety teachers. The program was initiated in 2008. It started teaching in hotel pools and employed one swim teacher and one volunteer. It has now trained over 60 local swim teachers and successfully taught around 3,000 children between the ages of 8 – 15 how to swim.

Water Safety Vietnam is a not for profit organisation registered in Australia and was founded by a group of experienced swimming and water safety personnel who became aware of the extremely high death by drowning rate in Asia. In Vietnam, 13,000 children drown every year. That is 35 children per day.

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

Through both of these organistations AUSTSWIM has trained over 150 local community members in the AUSTSWIM Teacher of Swimming and Water Safety™ course.

Over the 12 months Presenter
Training has been completed for two
Vietnamese teachers who work with
the Swim Vietnam charity group. The
training also included them visiting
Perth, Western Australia to observe
further courses and undertake further
presenter training. The accreditation of
these two individuals as AUSTSWIM
Presenters will further enhance delivery
of AUSTSWIM training in Vietnam.

### **OTHER COUNTRIES**

AUSTSWIM continues to provide on request training in other international countries, this year this included China, Thailand, Indonesia and Malaysia.

### **NEW ZEALAND**

AUSTSWIM works in partnership in NZ with Water Safety New Zealand.

In 2012 Water Safety NZ focused on strengthening AUSTSWIM's profile in New Zealand and expanding the quality courses AUSTSWIM had to offer to the aquatic industry.

With a new change in the role of AUSTSWIM Programme Coordinator in 2013 and a strong marketing campaign AUSTSWIM is starting to build up their momentum and profile in the aquatic industry.

This year highlights the focus Water Safety NZ placed on expanding the reach of AUSTSWIM.

Royal Life Saving NT is a sub agency of AUSTSWIM and delivers courses to participants across the Northern Territory to ensure quality and consistency across all swimming and water safety programs.

The AUSTSWIM NT State Advisory Committee (Table 1) consists of stakeholders and volunteers from across the Territory and is chaired by Petina Franklin. Members meet twice per year and as required. This year meetings were held on the 8/3/2013 and 29/5/2013. The key challenge continues to be the lack of qualified AUSTSWIM teachers. This year 19 AUSTSWIM courses were conducted across the NT with 185 enrolments. This project aims to ensure that courses will be run in remote locations for small numbers and that a customised learning plan will be implemented to assist aboriginal people become AUTSWIM qualified teachers of swimming and water safety. In 2012/2013 the number of remote courses represented nearly 50% of enrolments . Many courses would have been cancelled without this funding and the mentoring program is working well. We currently have 7 aboriginal people completing their qualifications.

There has been continued ongoing development of Regional Hubs and interaction state wide. AUSTSWIM has linked further regions into the hubs enabling training and resources to be available to support networking between venues. Resources being shared has included available teachers between seasonal and all year venues enabling consistent employment and lessons for all.

There was an increase in the number of nominations for WA State Awards 2012 with only one category, AUSTSWIM Teacher of Adults™ not nominated, thus highlighting the fantastic skills and knowledge within the aquatic industry in WA. The presentation of awards after the Keynote at the King Neptune conference also proved to be successful with all conference delegates in attendance supporting all winners of the awards.

The AUSTSWIM MATE™ Club beginning – metropolitan and regional venues are preparing for the inception of clubs and confirming of initial AUSTSWIM MATE™ Debitsuccess Community Seminars to be facilitated prior and then subsequently again during the year. AUSTSWIM WA has also applied for funding to develop regional AUSTSWIM MATE™ Debitsuccess Club/s to begin the community engagement supporting the regional venues. The overall outcome for the AUSTSWIM MATE™ Club will be very exciting once all clubs begin linking and networking across the state.

### STATE OPERATIONS

### **WESTERN AUSTRALIA CONTINUED**

There has been a focus on further presenter training and there are currently fourteen trainees for the AUSTSWIM Teacher of Swimming & Water Safety™ course underway. The introduction of trainee presenters in regional areas of high need is an ongoing project within WA, ensuring all communities within WA have access to consistent delivery of AUSTSWIM courses. The new trainees have also brought new ideas and skills to the already experienced knowledgeable presenters of WA. Presenters are also upskilling and adding additional areas of expertise with two additional presenters in TAI, two additional presenters in Adult and two trainee presenters in Infant which will result in increasing the options of delivery of multiple courses, in particular regional areas.

AUSTSWIM has provided ongoing support and recognition of SCAWA professional development day supporting the swim schools within WA as needed. In addition to this AUSTSWIM has supported the LIWA state wide conferences and seminars – metropolitan and regional through attendance.





### CONCLUSION

### Future planning for AUSTSWIM WA includes:

- Official WA launch of TAI courses currently facilitated however will combine launch with new Ambassadors for TAI & MATE in WA thus supporting the overall project of AUSTSWIM MATE™ Clubs throughout WA. Enables the community to see the benefits and hear the experiences by two local community members whom are very enthusiastic of the benefits of water and aquatic activities.
- Continuing development of regional presenters six of current fourteen trainees are regional based.
- Increased delivery of professional development throughout WA for both swimming teachers, swim schools and presenters.
- Supporting smaller communities to ensure quality training is received.
- Seeking alternative funding sources to assist with overall strategic planning and projects in WA.


### **CONCLUSION**
