Role-specific skills to look for : HTML, JavaScript, CSS, version control systems, front end frameworks, web design, responsive design, APIs, debugging

Soft skills to look for: Adaptability, Creativity, communication skills, attention to detail, and ability to work in a team.

Role-Based Interview Questions to ask a Front-end Developer



What is the fundamental skills Front end developer you think must have?

Purpose of the question: Being aware of the responsibility and skills required as a professional is a sign of a top candidate.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for the specific skills required for a Front-end developer and if the candidate will be able to fit in the company culture or not.



Explain how you would ensure that your web design is user-friendly and what kinds of steps would you use?

Purpose of the question: The question is designed to make sure that the candidate has knowledge of what kind of steps need to be taken to provide a user great experience on a website.

What to listen for in candidate response: An ideal candidate would talk about working together with user experience designers to conceptualize and design a webpage that promotes a user-oriented experience



Describe what is the difference between Null and Undefined?

Purpose of the question: Knowledge of basic coding concepts like null and undefined is critical for any programmer, hence a Front-end developer must have hands-on knowledge with concepts like these.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for specific terms that explain the meaning of Null and Undefined.



How do you deal with browser-specific style incompatibility?

Purpose of the question: The question is designed to get to know if the candidate has knowledge of the way different browsers read and interpret codes differently.

What to listen for in candidate response: A top candidate would list out the ways to operate about browser-specific style incompatibility.



How do you structure your source code to make it easy to leverage by your colleagues?

Purpose of the question: As teamwork and cooperation are one of the major skills for any developer, hence this question is designed to know if the candidate knows how to work with code to make it easier for others to understand.

What to listen for in candidate response: Candidates need to discuss their use of code organization and commenting, to ensure the efficiency of understanding amongst collaborators.



How do you ensure that your web design is user-friendly?

Purpose of the question: If a website is easy to access, then they will stay: otherwise they leave, hence providing a user-oriented experience is critical to a front-end developer's job role.

What to listen for in candidate response: Top candidate would explain working together with user-experienced designers to conceptualize and design a webpage that promotes a user-oriented experience.



What is Clear?

Purpose of the question: The following question is designed to test the knowledge of the candidate about the basics under front-end development.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for specific terms that explain the meaning of Clear.



Can you explain float CSS?

Purpose of the question: Since float is one of the fundamental concepts used over different programming languages, hence its function in CSS is important for a front-end developer.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for specific terms that explain the meaning of float in CSS.



How is HTML different from XHTML?

Purpose of the question: These topics are critical of front-end development, it is important for any front-end developer to research a company before applying.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for the points that show the difference between HTML and XHTML.



Explain How To Use A Function A Class?

Purpose of the question: The following question is designed to test the knowledge of the candidate about the basics of programming.

What to listen for in candidate response: A top candidate would explain the answer using a sample program.

Situational Interview Questions to ask a Front-end Developer



Was there a time when you experienced pushback on a project you were working on? How did you manage the situation?

Purpose of the question: This question is designed to learn how dedicated are the candidates towards their vision and are able to make a case for development decisions they believe in.

What to listen for in candidate response: Look for candidates who have navigated the pushback gracefully, listening to the feedback and explaining their perspective.



Describe your experience on a difficult project that involved many stakeholders. How did you get the project done?

Purpose of the question: This question is asked to know about the collaborative skills of a candidate.

What to listen for in candidate response: Look for signs where the candidate took charge and motivated the rest of the team.



If you could master one technology this year, which would you choose, and how would you go about doing it?

Purpose of the question: Using this question can be used to test a candidate's ambition and willingness to learn.

What to listen for in candidate response: Ideal candidates will already be taking steps to master their chosen technology.



What are some principles every software developer should follow, in your opinion?

Purpose of the question: Being aware of the responsibility and skills required as a professional is a sign of a top candidate.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for the specific skills required for a Front-end developer and if the candidate fits the company culture or not.



How do you set goals for yourself, can you give an example?

Purpose of the question: Since the planning of goals and time management is a critical ability for this job role, hence this question tests the same.

What to listen for in candidate response: Ideal candidates would elaborate on what basis they set their goals and their dedication towards them.



Why do you want to work for our company?

Purpose of the question: This question is designed to know what kind of information does the candidate has about your company culture and what has excited them to join your organization.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for the detail about what has driven the candidate to work for your organization.



How do you deal with a failed deadline?

Purpose of the question: Being able to deal with deadlines is a sign of a top candidate.

What to listen for in candidate response: Look for evidence of sincerity and dedication.



Where do you see yourself in the next 5 years?

Purpose of the question: This question is designed to understand the future goals and if that is relevant and realistic to the position.

What to listen for in candidate response: Listen for the skills the candidate wants to develop and how would it help the company.



What are your salary expectations?

Purpose of the question: This question is helps in understanding what the market is currently paying for certain qualifications, experience, and skills.

What to listen for in candidate response: Top candidates would give the range of salary they expect.



What influenced you in this career?

Purpose of the question: With this question, you can test the candidate's dedication, influence, and self-awareness.

What to listen for in candidate response: An ideal candidate should be able to work in both situations.
