### Role-Based Interview Questions to ask a Product Manager



What is your favorite product by our company? How would you make it better?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to understand the candidate's understanding of the current product and if they can list out the pros and cons of what you're putting out.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** An ideal candidate would point out the pros and cons of the product and something they would like to change.

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How proficient are you with the "X"(any tool used by the product management team for various purposes) tool?

**Purpose of the question:** This question can be asked to understand how much training the candidate would need to work at the same pace as the team.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen for evidence of proficiency with the required tools.

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How would you redesign one of our products?

**Purpose of the question:** Building roadmaps for products is one of the major responsibilities and required skills for a product manager, hence this question is designed to test the same.

**Purpose of the question:** Top candidates would explain their step-to-step strategy to build a roadmap of redesigning a product.

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What is one of your most successful products as a product manager?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to evaluate the qualitative and quantitative measures that can identify a strong product manager.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would be able to point to simplify their achievements in terms that relate to business results.

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What is the difference between PLM and ERP?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to understand how much the candidate knows about crucial product management software required in this job position.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen for the specific terms that can differentiate between PLM and ERP.

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How would you describe market opportunity in a business plan?

**Purpose of the question:** This question can be asked to analyze the candidate's experience and what they have learned from the same.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Look for the specific terms that describe market opportunity in a business plan.

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What are the most important elements of competitive analysis?

**Purpose of the question:** You can ask this question to understand how much a candidate knows about crucial product management topics like competitive analysis.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen if the candidate has an understanding of both the business and technical aspects of competitive analysis.

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How do you juggle between B2B and B2C market segments?

**Purpose of the question:** An interviewer can ask this question to get to know the candidate's understanding of markets and their management skills.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would describe how they would build different roadmaps and strategies to juggle between B2B and B2C markets.

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How do you know a product is designed well?

**Purpose of the question:** Understanding what are elements need to be prioritized and planning to work on them accordingly is crucial to this job position.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would show sensitivity to the specific requirements of a business's product.

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How would you introduce new product features to customers?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to measure the marketing strategies of the candidate and whether they propose appropriate steps.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen for the specific steps that would be required to introduce new product features to customers.

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# Situational Interview Questions to ask Product Manager



How do you gain credibility from a new development team as a new product manager?

**Purpose of the question:** By asking this question the interviewer can get to know what the candidates do while they are working in detail.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen for the explanations that describe the candidate's decision-making, and communication skills, and respect for the team.

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What is your strongest skill set as a product manager?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to understand what is a candidate good at and what can they bring to a table.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would describe what the success of their project has lead them to.

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How do you determine a time estimation of a product's release?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to test the candidate's management skills.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Look for evidence of leadership qualities related to project planning and execution.

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What have you learned from your previous mistakes as a Product Manager?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to learn about the collaboration, dedication, and other skills of a candidate.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Pay attention to the answer and look if the examples shared, are fairly inconsequential, unintentional, and a learned lesson should be gleaned from it.

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What challenges are you looking for in this Product Manager position?

**Purpose of the question:** The question is designed to understand and determine what the candidates are looking for in their next job and whether they would be a good fit for the position being hired for.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would discuss how they would like to be able to effectively utilize their skills and experience if they were hired for the job.

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Are there any new skills or technology you have learned in recent times?

**Purpose of the question:** Being updated with the latest trends in the market is a sign of a top candidate.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Look for evidence of the understanding of the new trends in the candidate.

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Why do you want to work for our company?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is designed to know what kind of information does the candidate has about your company culture and what has excited them to join your organization.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Listen for the detail about what has driven the candidate to work for your organization.

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What skills do you think are necessary for this job role?

**Purpose of the question:** Since software developers rely on a combination of technical knowledge and transferable skills to be successful. Therefore it is important for an applicant for this role to show the required skills.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Look for evidence of the required skills for this job role.

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What are your salary expectations?

**Purpose of the question:** This question is helps in understanding what the market is currently paying for certain qualifications, experience, and skills.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would give the range of salary they expect.

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Do you have any questions for us?

**Purpose of the question:** The question is designed to know how interested the candidates are in your company.

**What to listen for in candidate response:** Top candidates would ask questions and show interested in the job and company-related details.
