Navigating federal funding in 2022

From CARES to CRRSA to the latest American Rescue Plan Act, K-12 relief offers the chance to provide the support students need to get back on track.

The latest American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act allocates \$130 billion for states to disburse to K-12 and expands upon provisions in the CARES and CRRSA Act.

Districts have the flexibility to use these funds for anything from pandemic-related safety costs to addressing socioemotional needs to supporting teachers.

Notably, at least 20% of the ARP Act funds must be used to address learning loss. The funds will enable districts to set up large-scale evidence-based initiatives—like high-dosage tutoring or extending learning programs—shown to curb losses and accelerate learning.

Funds are distributed to states using the Title I formula under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESSA).

Billions in CARES Act Funding went <u>unused</u>. To avoid funds being reallocated, districts should request CRRSA or ARP Act funding as soon as possible to assist teachers and students who have the greatest need.
