Understand what college will really cost.

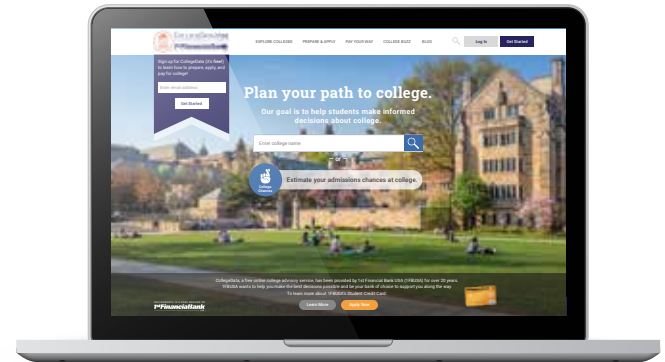
