

Indie Agreement

On Browzwear's acceptance of your application to join the Indie program, we will grant you a license for VStitcher and Tech Pack Editor, under the terms of our [End User License Agreement](#).

- Payment: none.
- License term: starts when we accept your application to join the current Indie program and ends when that Indie program ends.
- License type: commercial - not a Community license.
- Onboarding training will be provided by giving you access, free of charge, to the Browzwear University during the license term.
- Support will be provided by the [Browzwear Help Center](#). For the avoidance of doubt, you will not be entitled to email, telephone, video-call, onsite, or other additional support services unless you purchase a separate maintenance contract.
- Stylezone: you will have access to this platform, free of charge, during the license term.

We may, at our sole option, extend the license term by giving you notice in writing.

At the end of the license term, should you wish to continue using the software, you may:

- (A) Apply for a Community license for the software. If we grant you a Community license, no payment is required, but you must adhere to the terms and conditions of the End User License Agreement relevant to a Community license.
- The standard Community license term is one calendar year.

Browzwear's aim is to build a strong community, where every end-user shares as much information as possible with the world. This EULA provides you with a non-commercial community license. This means that the output of the Software must be licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution Share Alike License and be accompanied with a downloadable link for source files. The following is a non-exhaustive list of how to implement this state of fairness:

1. If you offer websites an image manipulation software based on the Software, then all users of the Software have to present a downloadable link next to the images that allows their website visitors to download and create derivative works of the garments processed by the Software.
2. If you sell clothes, then any article of clothing has to include, on its label, a prominent link to download the files and a copy of the license.
