## **Opioid Crisis Exacerbated by COVID-19: What Employers Can Do**

Past IBI research on the health and productivity impact of substance use reveals that one in three employees are prescribed pain medication, and one in seven show problematic patterns of use. In an article published in Employee Benefit Adviser, IBI Researcher Erin Peterson discusses how COVID-19 may escalate the opioid crisis and what employers can do to prevent and address employee opioid use issues during these unprecedented times.

### **Upcoming Research from IBI**

IBI's focus on health and productivity research continues to move forward, and members can expect to see the following publications and webinars this summer:

- **PREVENTIVE SCREENINGS**: Screenings have great potential not only in improving quality of life for employees, but also reducing disability time and wage replacement cost for employers when they require treatment. IBI simulated such productivity outcomes of meeting screening guidelines for seven conditions: breast cancer, cervical cancer, colorectal cancer, hypertension, depression, diabetes and obesity to find the greatest opportunities for health and productivity gains.
- WORK IMPACT OF CAREGIVING: Employees who are caregivers may oftentimes have trouble balancing personal and work obligations. By analyzing two

different population-based surveys, IBI dives into the impact of caregiving on work, and how work policies might mitigate the burden of caregiving. The results aim to help employers recognize how caregiving impacts employees' abilities to contribute on the job—and make informed decisions when considering the value of caregiver benefits.

#### **IBI/Conference Board Health and Productivity Forum**

#### **CFO's Views on Health Benefit Strategy**

IBI will present findings from a survey of 318 Chief Financial Officers (CFOs) and other corporate senior financial executives on their perspective of the business value of their health benefits strategy—including healthcare and disability insurance, paid leave and sick days, and wellness/wellbeing programs. Included in the findings is also a review of business planning for emergencies prior to the COVID-19 pandemic and their company's ability to maintain operations and support employees in current times.


